## Mini Wimbledon

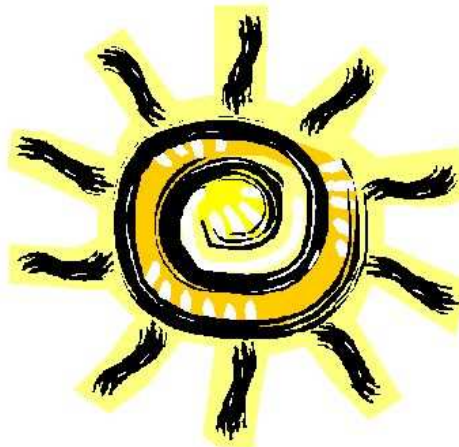
Keep Wimbledon alive and try holding a tennis tournament amongst your friends or work colleagues - with each person paying an entry fee. You could also charge non-participants to watch.
